The Results Are In!

On January 22, 2026, the Brevard County CoC conducted its annual Point-in-Time (PIT) Count—a one-night census of individuals experiencing homelessness in shelters, transitional housing, or places not meant for habitation. This *snapshot* underscores how many of our neighbors lacked a safe place to call home that night—and reinforces our shared commitment to building a...

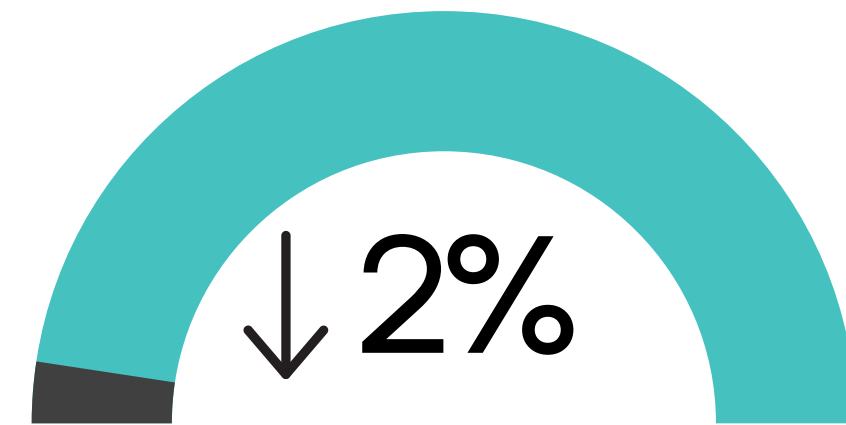

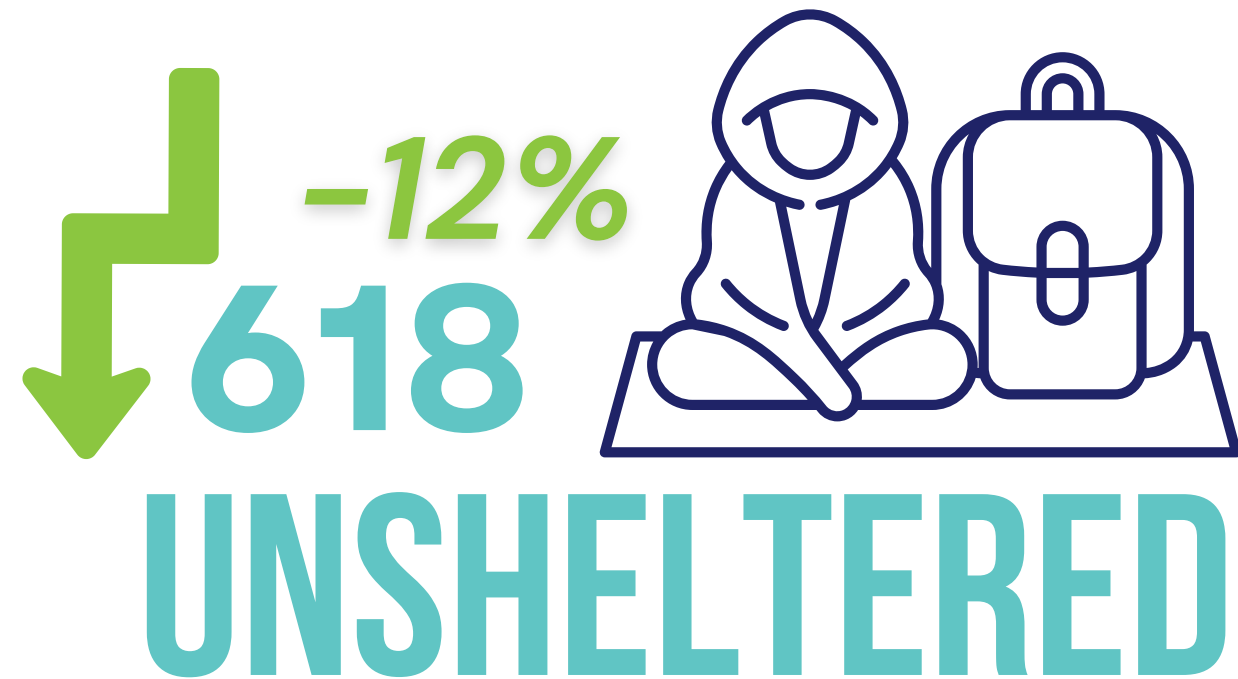


MOST INDIVIDUALS EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS ARE NOT UNKNOWN TO THE SYSTEM

83% have a record in the community's homeless services database (HMIS)



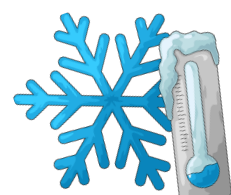

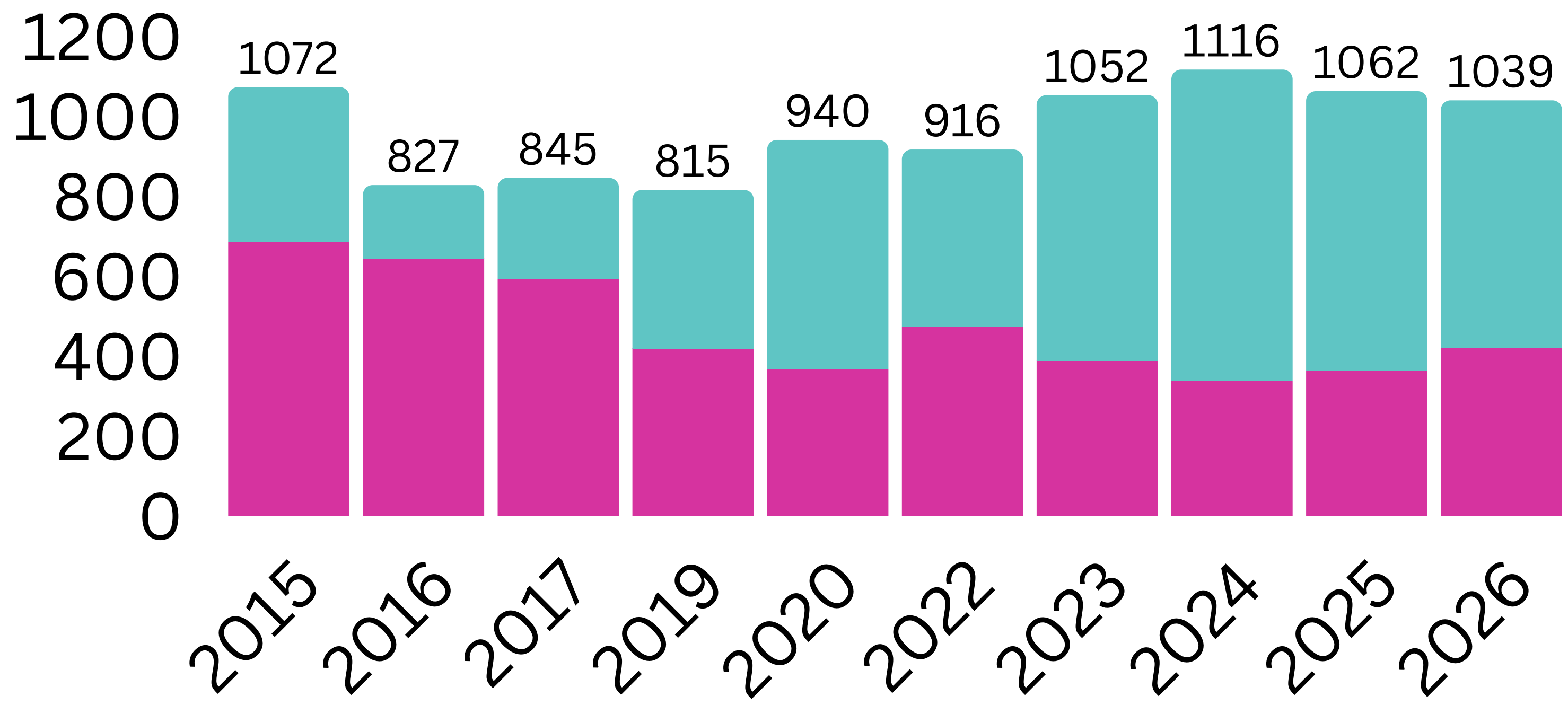

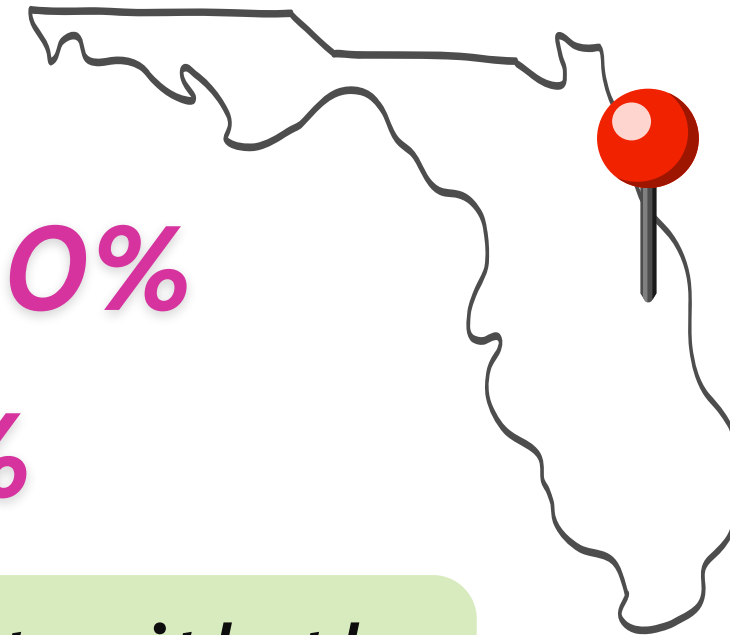

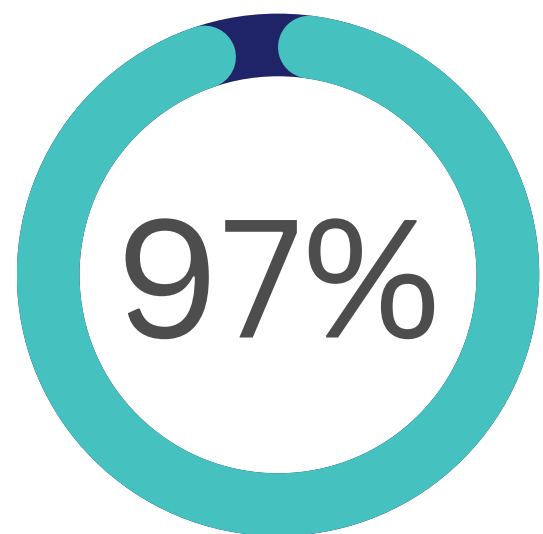

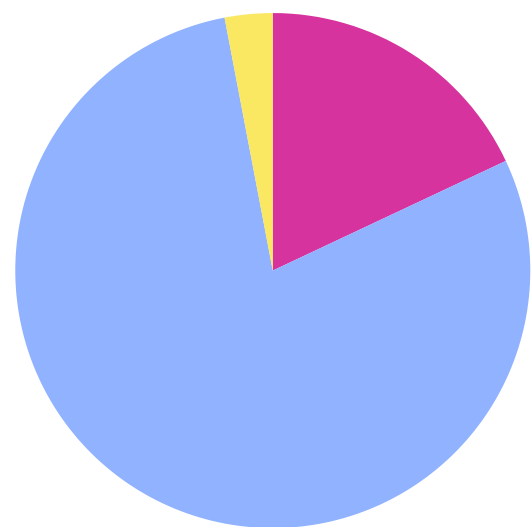
HOMELESSNESS IS HOME GROWN

88% of those unsheltered *first lost housing right here in Brevard (81% in 2025)*



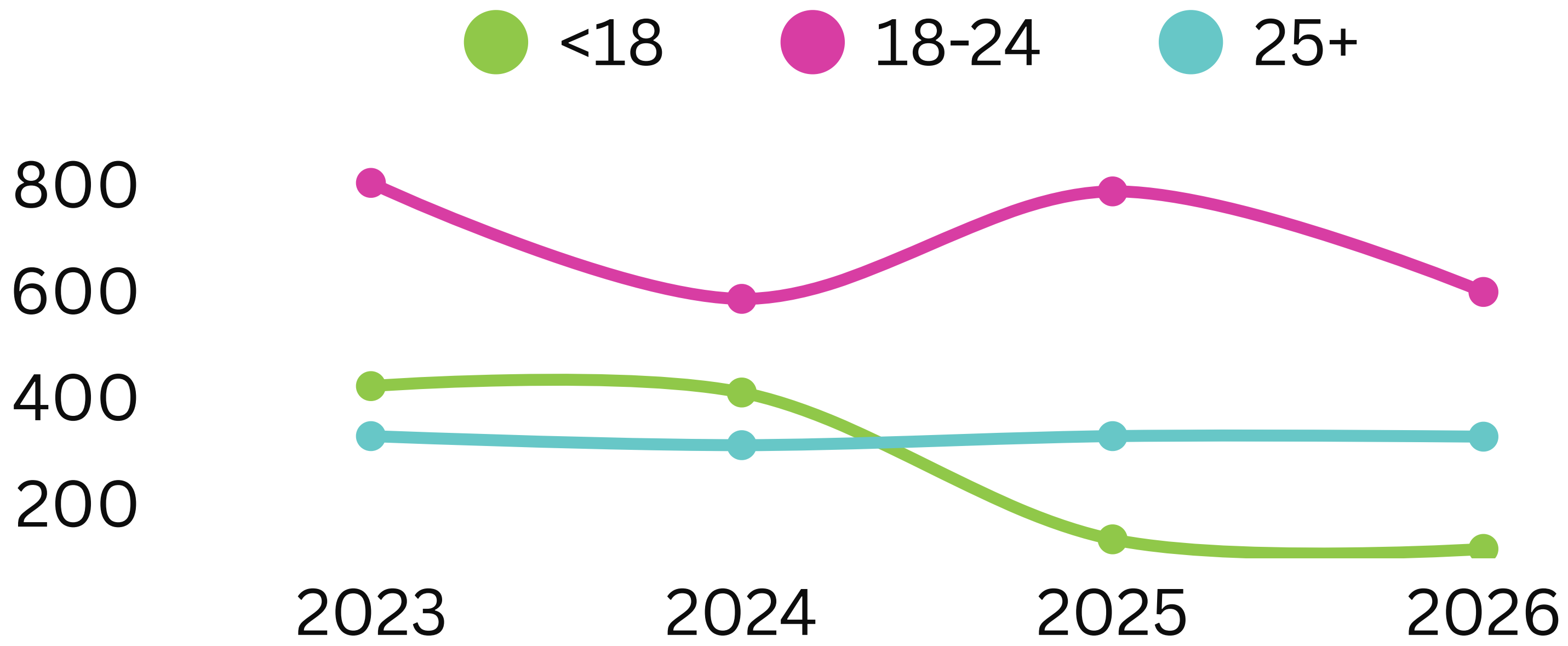
UNSHELTERED HOUSEHOLD TYPE

Families make up just 3% of the unsheltered population (2% in 2025), while individuals account for 97%.



SHELTERED HOUSEHOLD TYPE

*Families = 18% (down from 21% in 2025)
Individuals = 79%
Child-only = 3%*

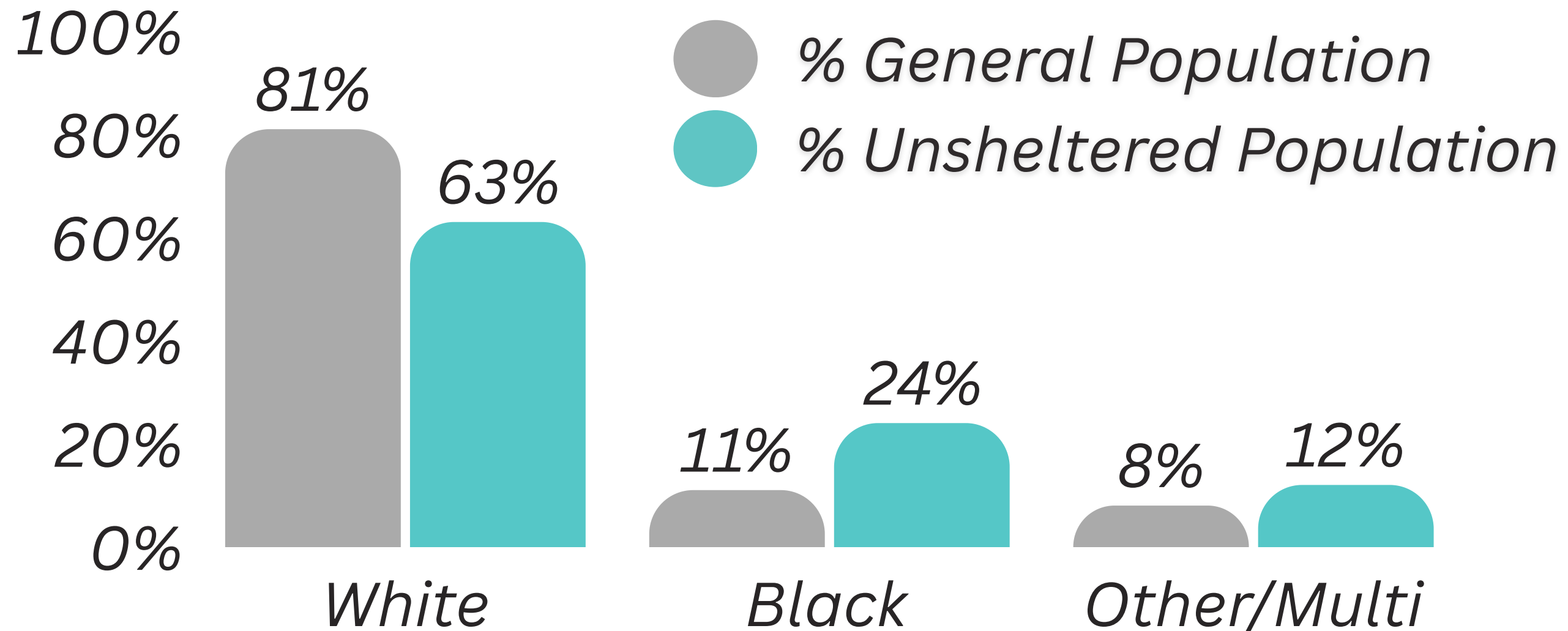

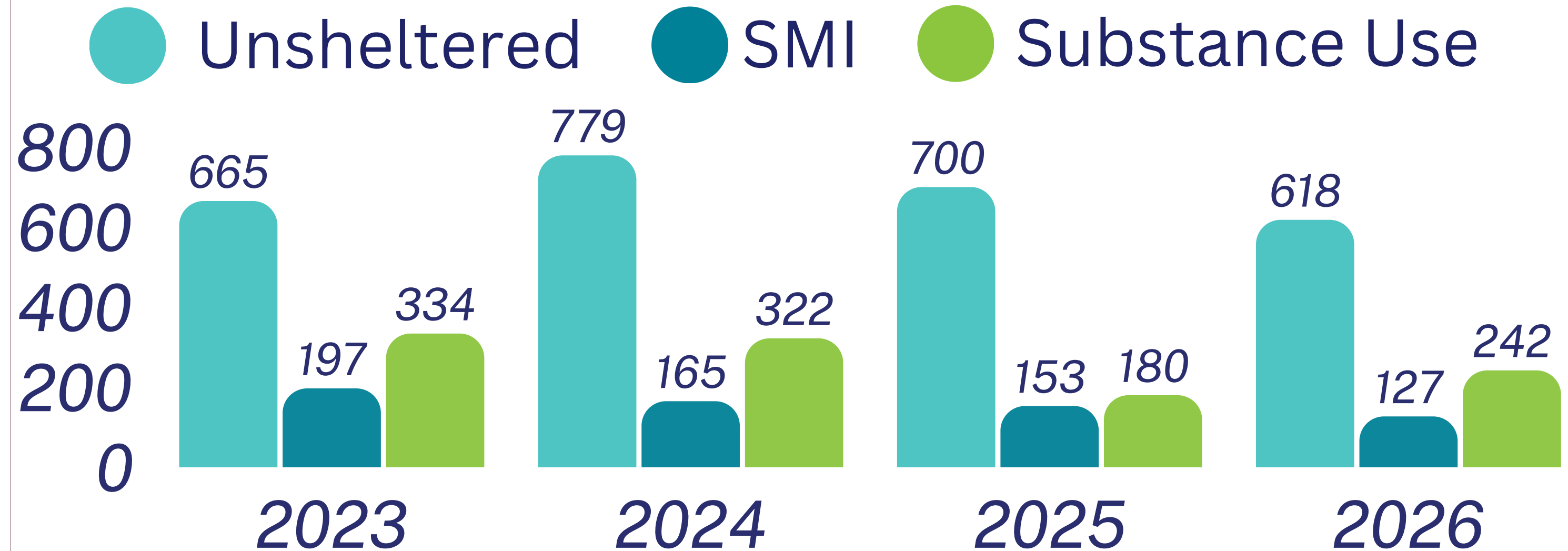

UNSHELTERED RACIAL DISPARITIES



Black residents represent **11%** of the population but **24%** of those unsheltered — and **71%** of those reporting prior incarceration

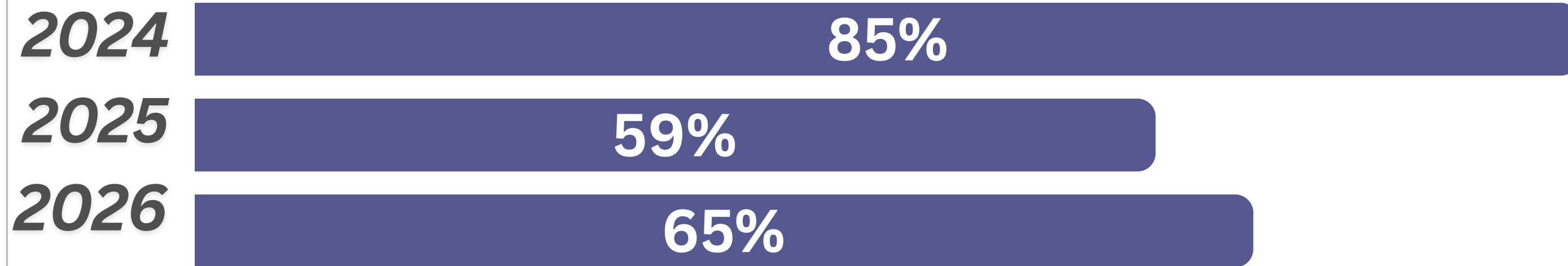
BEHAVIORAL HEALTH CONDITION



In 2026, **21%** had a serious mental illness (SMI) and **14%** had a substance use disorder (SUD). Most aren't in a behavioral health crisis — **they're in a housing crisis.**

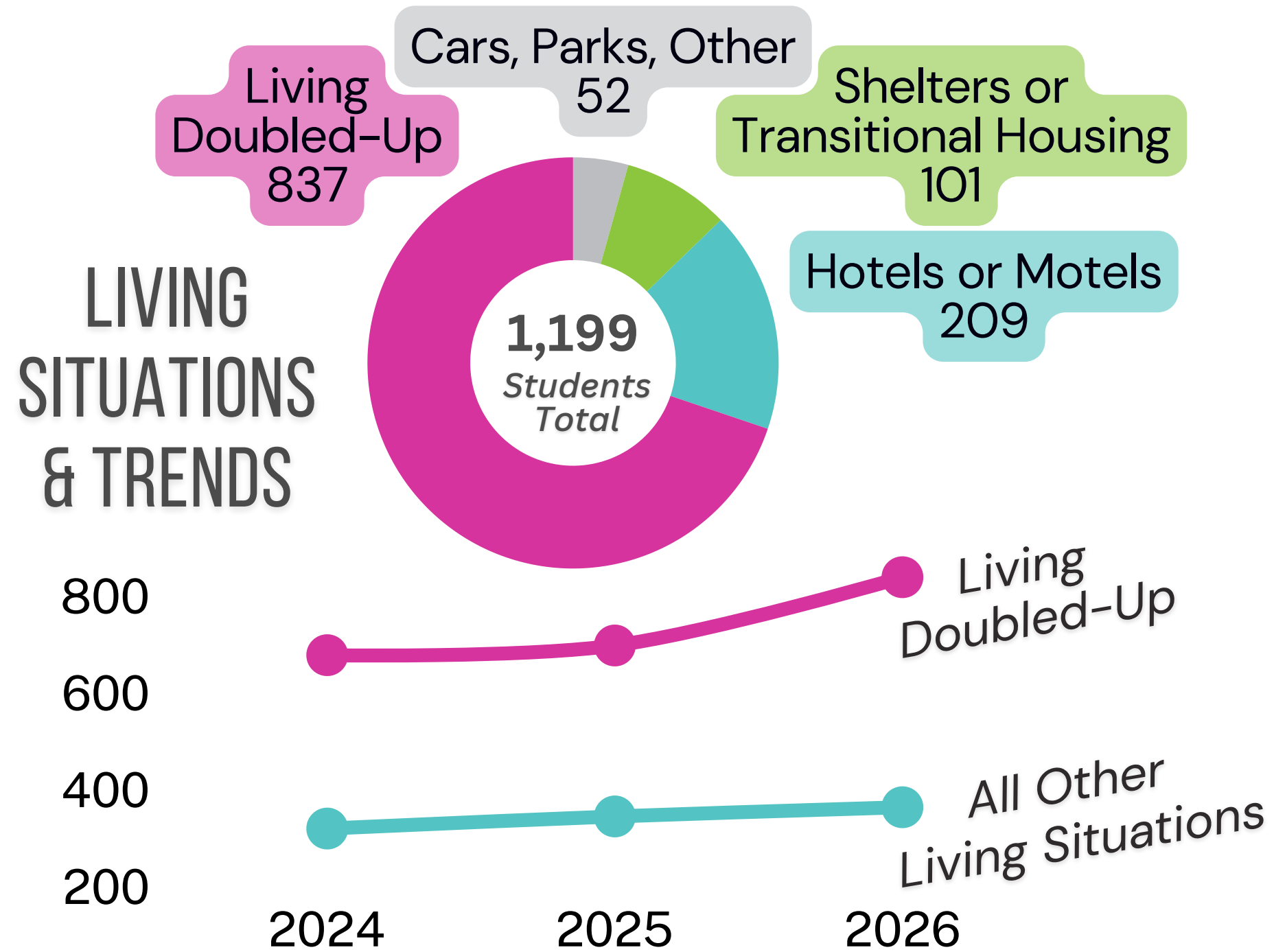

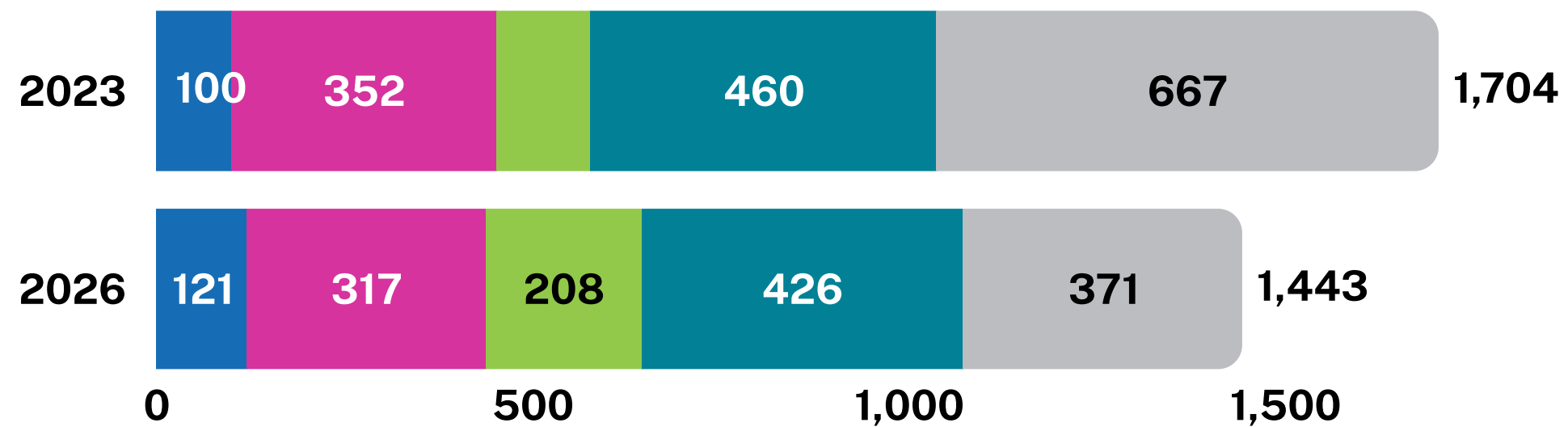

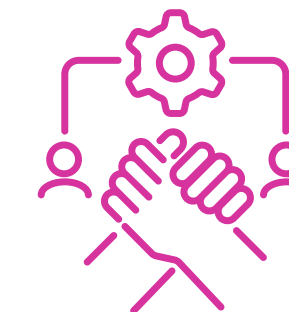

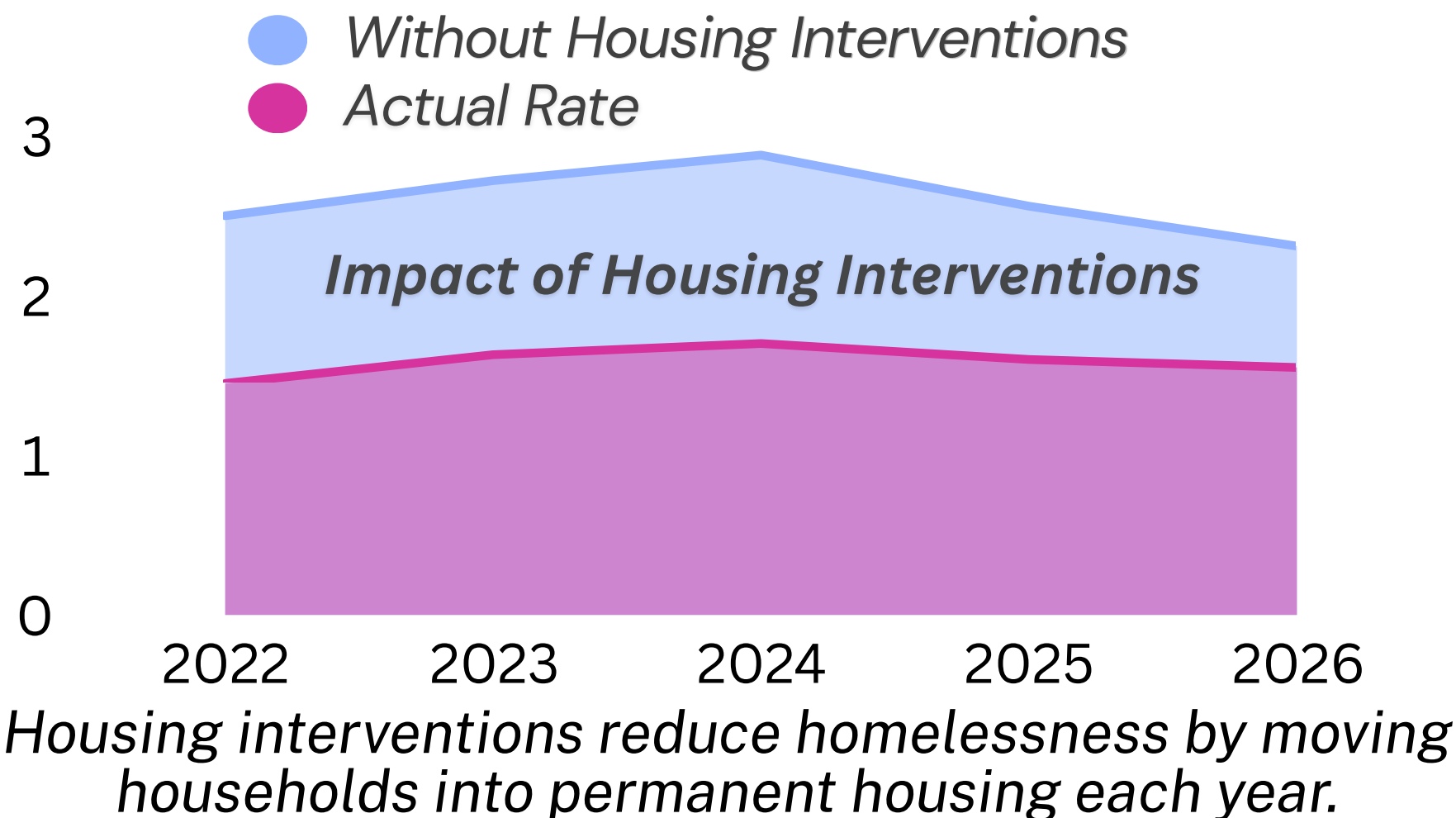

SYSTEM IMPACT OF HOUSING INTERVENTIONS

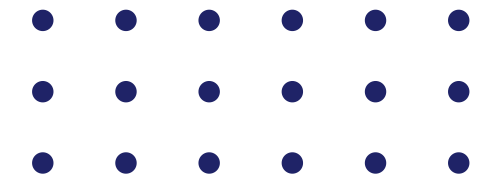
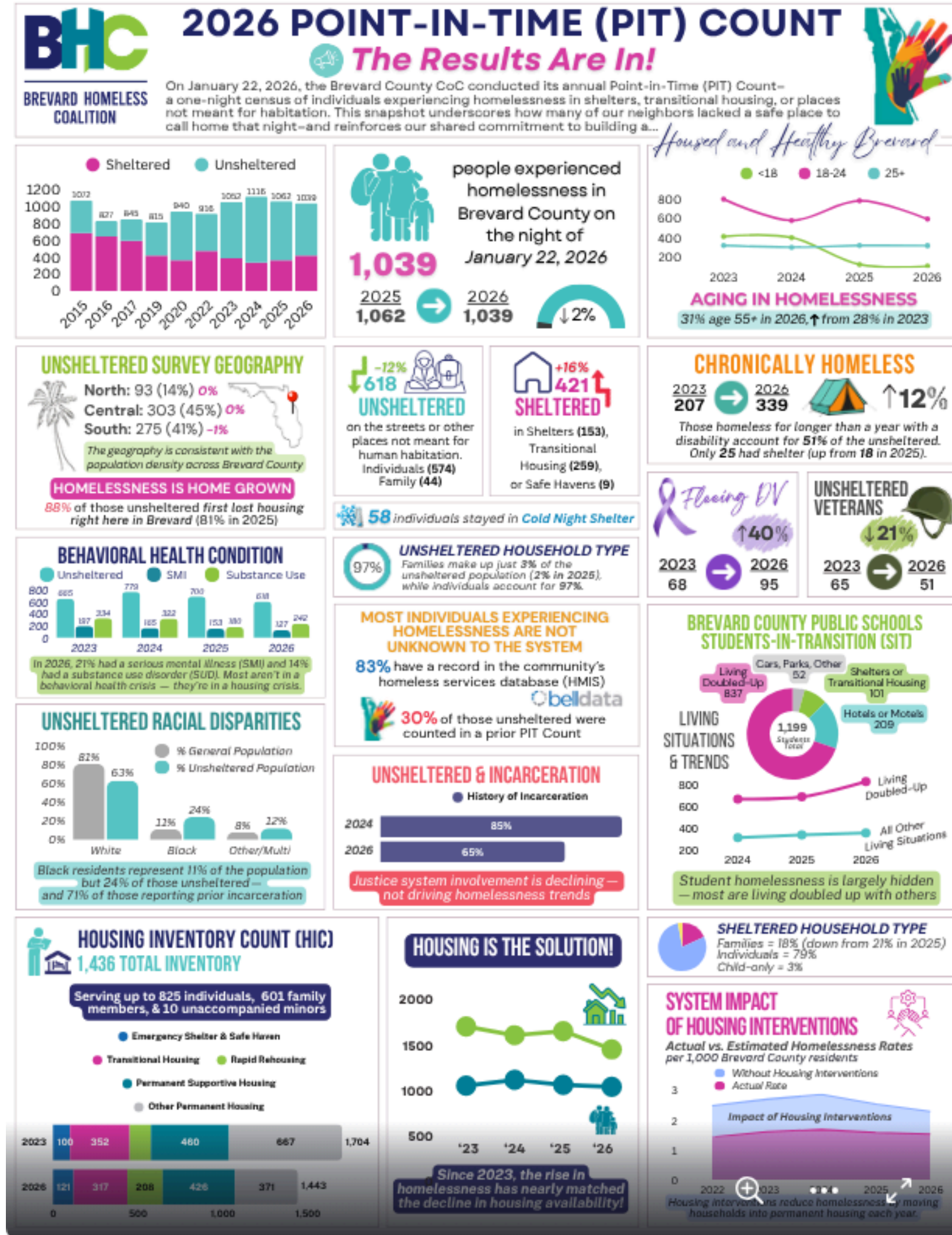


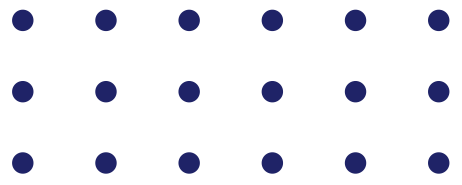
*Actual vs. Estimated Homelessness Rates
